# The 7 C's of Grace of Giving

### (Lesson #1)

- I. Followed the Pattern of David's Giving to Build a Temple for the Lord of 1 Chr. 22:14; 29:3-4
  - A. David's Giving Was *Concerted* (i.e. *planned*) Giving cf 2 Sam. 8:11; 1 Ki. 7:51; 1 Chr. 18:11; 1 Chr. 26:26; 29:3
  - B. David's Giving *Corresponded* to His *Capacity* cf 1 Chr. 26:14; 29:3

- C. David's Giving Was the Result of a *Conscious* Deliberate *Choice* to Give cf 1 Chr. 29:14
- D. <u>Cheerful</u> Giving cf 1 Chr.l 29:3
- E. David's Giving Reveals Four Seven <u>Conspicuous</u> Features Which Are to be <u>Characteristics</u> of the Believer's Giving in the Economy of Grace
- II. The New Testament Teaches Believers Are to Give in Accordance with Seven <u>C's</u>
  - A. Believers Are <u>Commanded</u> to Participate in Giving cf 1 Cor. 16:1-2; 2 Cor. 8:11

## (Lesson #3)

- B. Believers Are to Give *Cheerfully* cf 2 Cor. 9:7
  - 1. The <u>Motivation</u> for Being a Cheerful Giver: God <u>Loves</u> It and the Cheerful Giver; The Word 'Loves' Is the Translation of the Greek Verb (ἀγαπάω); English Transliteration agapao in This Context the Word Means <u>Desires</u> and <u>Delights</u> in cf Mt. 23:6; Mk. 12:38; Lk. 11:43; Jn. 3:19; 12:43 for This Sense of the Word

- 2. The Word 'Cheerful' is <u>Emphasized</u> in the Greek Text by Being Placed First in the Word Oder of the Clause
  - a. Stresses the *Importance* God Places on Givers Having Cheerful Attitudes
  - b. A <u>Gracious Cheerful Giver</u>. The Word <u>Cheerful</u> is the Translation of the Greek Word (ιλαρός); English Translation <u>hilaros</u>, the Word Can Have the Sense of <u>Favor</u> to See the Word Used with This Meaning Compare The <u>Septuagint</u> Translation of Prv. 19:12; The <u>Septuagint</u> Uses the Greek Word (ιλαρός = hilaros) to Translate the Hebrew Word (႞Ϟ϶϶϶); English Transliteration <u>raswon</u> Which Is Used to Express the Idea of <u>Unmerited</u> Favor of Deut. 33:23; Psalm 5:12; Psalm 30:5; 89:17; 106:4
- C. <u>Conscious Choice</u> to Give Willingly cf 2 Cor. 8:10-12; 9:7
- D. Carefully <u>Considered</u> and <u>Concerted</u> (i.e. Planned) Giving cf 1 Cor. 16:2; 2 Cor. 9:7

- E. Not *Coerced* cf 2 Cor. 9:7
- F. The Amount Given is to <u>Correspond</u> with the <u>Capacity</u> One Has to Give cf 1 Cor. 16:2; 2 Cor. 8:12

### Lesson #5

- G. Grace Giving Is to Be *Consistent* of 1 Cor. 16:2
  - 1. Three Grammatical Observations About the Greek Verb (τίθημι); English Transliteration *tithemi*; The Word is Translated 'Lay Up', 'Set Aside' in 1 Cor. 16:2 and Their **Implications** 
    - a. Third Person, Singular Form and Points to the *Individual* Responsibility of Each Believer
    - b. Imperative Mood Form Meaning This Is A Command thus a *Divine Directive*

- c. Present Tense Form Which Denotes *Continual, Ongoing, Regular, Repetitive Action* and Is the Second Way the Verse Teaches That the Believer's Participation is to Be *Consistent, Regular*
- 2. Consistent Giving Does Not Demand That the Believer Must Give a <u>Definite Amount</u>
  - a. Believers Are **Not** Commanded to Give a **Definite** Amount
  - b. Believers Are Not Commanded to Give a **Definite Percentage**
  - c. Believers Are Commanded to Always Give *Consistently* in a Manner That Corresponds to Their Current *Capacity*
